My father, Beverly Lloyd, stressed the importance of living below your means and to never getting into debt. Although I cherished his message, I didn't really know how to do these two simple things.


During my twenties and thirties, I was fairly normal, living paycheck to paycheck, having a car loan, and carrying some credit card debt. In my forties, my husband, Eric, and I became weird. We got on the same page about money. We realized the differences between our wants versus our needs. We got on a written budget, closed our credit cards, and started using cash for purchases. We are now 100% debt free, and we live and give like never before.

The behaviors that we have adopted have not only improved our financial wellness, but have also enhanced other areas of wellness:

- •The top line in our budget is giving. (Spiritual Wellness)
- •Because my husband and I have learned to communicate about money and together we have learned to live below our means, we don't have money fights. Our marriage is stronger than ever. (Emotional Wellness)
- •I take my lunch to work most days. I save money, and I save on calories. (Physical Wellness)
- •I chose not to join a gym and pay membership fees. I walk outdoors with friends. (Social Wellness)
- •I read personal finance books. (Intellectual Wellness)

The last example, and probably the most important, is that we talk to our sons about financial wellness. Jacob is 8 and Lucas is 5. They have already learned that hard work pays off. With the money they have received as gifts and earned while performing jobs around the house, they have learned to give a little, save a little, and spend a little. Though so young, they are already on a solid path to financial wellness.


