hearts. Hearts with walls so solid that even when face-to-face with God we turn and walk away sadly because we have too much to give up. How painful is ministry in that world?

Painful. Very painful.

Can you imagine a team of oxen, yoked together, pulling a plow across a concrete parking lot? The level of futility in that thought is mind boggling. And yet that is exactly what we are called to do. Fix the harnesses, tighten the straps, sharpen the plow and get to work. Why?

Because it will not be because of the work that we do but it will be about the work that God does to soften those hearts for our plow to pull across. Therein lies faith. I have to believe that God can do enough to peel away the layers so that the exposed hearts can experience Christ in ways that I could never imagine. That's what ministry looks like.
