Ending and Beginning... in Prayer

When the three years of his earthly ministry were ending and the three days of his passion were beginning, Jesus went to his knees in prayer... calling on and yielding to his – and our – Father in heaven. If prayer is how Jesus ended one thing and began the next, there is the path for us as 2017 ends and 2018 begins. Indeed, all 365 days of each year are best begun and ended when we engage in conversation with our heavenly Father – speaking to him... and listening to him twice as much as we speak. It's why he gave us two ears and one mouth.

If we are to rise up as the church, the place to begin is on our knees. So, on Sunday, December 31, Monday, January 1, and Tuesday, January 3, the council and I and our staff ask you to join us in **Three Days of Prayer**. Pastor Chip's message on December 31 will speak to this. If you attended Christmas Eve service, you received a Three Days of Prayer booklet to help guide our praying together. You can also download one here. Together with several hundred congregations from our LCMC association (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ) across America and the globe will be praying for **repentance**, asking God to hear our **petitions**, and guiding us toward our **vision**.

As 2017 ends and 2018 begins, there are two particular aspects of our life together on which I ask you to pray. First, pray for your family and for your role in it. Ask the Lord to have free reign in your household and to make y'all hungry for his word. Especially if you happen to be a father, it is your calling to love and lead your family in prayer and daily reading of scripture. We all fail at this; so fess up... and hear this promise as from Christ himself: you are forgiven. Have fun reading the Word and praying together; don't make a chore out of it... but let it be your happy duty to call on the Lord **a lot**... several times a day. He loves it when you ask. If you need a place to start, try: the Small Catechism, Egermeier's Bible Story Book, or the Gospel of Mark. If you need help, just ask.

Secondly, please pray for our congregational leaders... because the hope of the world is not a government nor a party; the hope of the world is the local congregation working rightly. So pray for those already serving in leadership positions (council, boards, small group leaders, staff)... and pray for our nominating committee – led by Linda Schlather. I and the committee ask you to pray for the Lord to raise up leaders who are spiritually mature and committed not to their own agendas, but to our mission, vision and priorities. 2018 St. Paul Wild Game Dinner – It is almost here!

The 14th annual Wild Game Dinner will be held on Saturday, February 3, 2018 at the New Braunfels Civic and Conversion Center. Please save the date, volunteer to help, and invite your neighbors!

This is the main community outreach and fellowship event for St. Paul. The committee has set a goal of serving 800 during the event. Three things need to happen to reach that goal. First and most important is the guidance of our Lord. Second is the involvement of the St. Paul Church members as volunteers, donators, and event participants. Third is for you to invite your neighbors and your friends.

What Happens During the Event: In addition to the great fellowship, the event includes: dinner with a wide variety of wild game and **non-game items**, live and silent auctions, a drawing featuring a custom built rifle, and a dance featuring live music by local country artist, Bret Graham. The 2018 event will include a kids zone for additional family fun.

What Happens to the Proceeds: The 2018 benefactors are:

Youth Ministry – supports youth programs, including summer camps, mission trips, VBS and more

New Life Children's Center - a residential treatment center for severely troubled girls ages 11 - 17

Cross Trails Outfitters - a Christian-based youth outdoors program

Trinity Oaks - an outdoors experience for veterans, youth, terminally ill, and persons with disabilities

The Gabriel Project - a youth crisis pregnancy counseling and assistance program

Communities in Schools - provides support to help students stay in school and succeed in life

Texas Outdoor C.H.I.L.D. - provides hunting, fishing and outdoor adventures to youngsters between 8 and 20 years old that have experienced a life altering medical incident

From the President



The Gifts We Bring

Gift giving can be difficult at times. Let's face it: some people are hard to shop for! But have you ever stopped to wonder why gift-giving is important? What's a gift really about anyway? Giving gifts to friends and family is an ancient ritual of nearly every known human culture. Gifts signify a relationship (or the desire for one) and are meant to delight, honor, and/or surprise the recipient. In our attempt to do just that we seek to give a gift that is an expression of that loving relationship, but it often gets deduced down to giving the gift that a person either wants or needs but does not already have.


So what do we give Jesus, the King of kings? On Epiphany, we are fondly reminded of the story when magi journeyed from afar to worship the newborn King Jesus bringing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Now these were extraordinary gifts to be given to a child. But what should we give Jesus, today? What does Jesus need or want that he doesn't already have? What would bring him delight, honor, or surprise? And what do I really have to offer? In honor of the magi, I'd like to propose three gift-giving suggestions:

First of all, give Jesus yourself. Take time to be with him, commune with him, worship him, and walk with him. In the busy-ness of our day-to-day lives we can be neglectful of our relationship with Jesus. Remember above all else, Jesus desires to be in relationship with you and with me.

Secondly, give Jesus the very best of what he's given you. God has uniquely created you with interests and talents and abilities. In this Epiphany season, remember how Jesus is calling you to use what he's given you to give Jesus honor. Ask God for guidance of how you can serve him with the gifts he's already given you.

Finally, give Jesus the introduction to a friend. Just as Jesus desires to be in a relationship with you, he desires to have that with all of people. Take time to introduce Jesus to a friend. Do all your friends already know Jesus? Then it is time to make some new friends with people who don't! Pray for God to guide you every step of the way and watch with awe and wonder as the Holy Spirit creates faith in the heart of your friend.

In this season of Epiphany we are reminded of the privilege we have to delight, honor, and surprise Jesus with our gifts. Let's cherish every gift-giving opportunity and live our lives to the honor and glory of God, giving thanks for his goodness and mercy!




