There are moments in this job when the nature of humanity clearly comes through all of the chaos and it reminds me that we are definitely in need of a Savior. I would love to say that this is a new idea, but it's not. It's as old as the Garden of Eden itself. And, it is just made more obvious and accessible in a world that sustains itself with media of all types. I guess the hardest part is that we hope that we are immune or our little slice of the world is not susceptible to the evil in this world. Unfortunately, it just doesn't work like that. I hear peoples' stories daily and more often than not it is the same thing: "I want what I want.

want it now. And I don't want 'no' for an answer." That sense of selfishness seems to be the lens that we continually look at the world through. Unfortunately, it not only fills our world, but it creeps into our faith as well, yours, mine, everyone's.

The church at Philippi had succumbed to the selfishness that we are talking about. A church that Paul loved because of his time there, he wrote to them during his imprisonment to encourage them. Why did they need encouragement? Because of their lack of humility. Because they were being selfish and needed to be reminded that this was not Christlike.

Philippians 2:3-4 has Paul writing to this very problem: Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourself. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others.

These are important words for me and I hope they are important words for you as well. The truth is that we fail as a church as we get so wrapped up in us that we forget our role: Love God and love others. An age-old problem that God's people have struggled with from the beginning. So what? (Thanks for asking.)

- 1. Keep your eyes on the cross and not yourself. We need to be constantly focused on what we are called to do as believers. (Remember the Great Commission.)
- 2. Keep your eyes on others because of the cross. The cross calls us to serve....and serve in humility. There are plenty of hurting and broken people that need to hear the truth of the Gospel of Jesus.
- 3. Don't be discouraged by those who don't realize the truth that you speak of and live out. There is only one that we need to be concerned with and that it the Creator and Savior of this world.

The truth of Jesus is our central truth and nothing that this world has to offer will ever compare to Him. Never forget that and let it be a litmus test to our attitude and mindset of service to others.
