Wild Game Dinner 2020

The 16th annual Wild Game Dinner will be held on Saturday February 1, 2020 at the New Braunfels Civic and Conversion Center.

This is the main community outreach and fellowship event for St. Paul. The committee has set a goal of serving 800 during the event. Three things need to happen to reach that goal. First, and most important, is the guidance of our Lord and Savior. Second, is the involvement of the St. Paul Church members as volunteers, donors, and event participants. Third, is for you to invite your neighbors and your friends.

What Happens During the Event: In addition to the great fellowship, the event includes: dinner with a wide variety of wild game and non-game items (fried fish and chicken tenders), live and silent auctions, a drawings, and a dance featuring live music by local country artist Bret Graham. Donations for the live and silent auction are being received at the church office. For the 2020, event we have enhanced the kids zone.

What Happens to the Proceeds: The 2020 recipients are:

- Youth Ministry supports youth programs, including summer camps, mission trips, VBS, and more
- •New Life Children's Center a residential treatment center for severely troubled girls ages 11-17
- Cross Trails Outfitters a Christian-based youth outdoors program
- Trinity Oaks an outdoors experience for veterans, youth, terminally ill, and persons with disabilities
- The Gabriel Project a youth crisis pregnancy counseling and assistance program
- Communities in Schools provides support to help students stay in school and succeed in life
- Options for Life Nonprofit, Christ–centered organization dedicated to educating and encouraging people to choose life.
- •Reel Recovery a national Christian non-profit organization that conducts free fly-fishing retreats for men living with all forms of cancer

Now is the time to get involved: You can help by getting involved. There is help needed in all areas as we expect to serve in excess of 800 for the 2019 event. 

Preschool Ministry


