#### What is the source of your freedom?

"Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, 'if you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32) Jesus was out to free his hearers... But they did not want him as the source of their freedom. Indeed, they believed they were already free: "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone" (v.32). For the religious ones whose ears were too proud to hear Jesus, their freedom was sourced from their tribe, their genes, their race. They looked on ancestry.com and verified their bloodline from Abraham... so they thought that made them free.

In the 16th century, more religious people (the Roman Catholic hierarchy) tried to insist that your freedom is sourced through their system. A little monk with an ear for the Word confessed otherwise... and wrote out his confession in plain language and posted it on the town Facebook page for all to read. <u>https://www.luther.de/en/95thesen.html</u>

In the 21<sup>st</sup> century, Chase Bank wants you to think your freedom is sourced from their credit card. They have named it the "Freedom Card." Hmmm?

As Americans, you and I could say that our civil freedom is sourced from the Declaration of Independence and the men and women who have given their lives to protect that freedom. That is certainly true regarding our civil or political freedom.

As nice as that freedom is, Jesus knows there is a much deeper freedom at stake for you and me.

*"Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin."* (John 8:34) What good is all the political and financial freedom in the world to me, if I am still a slave to sin?

*"If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed"* (v.37). Ah, there he is, the source of true freedom. Crucified and raised from the dead, Jesus looks religious people, credit card holders, and Americans like you and me square in the eye and declares: "your sins are forgiven in my name." There you have it, your true freedom. Now, don't be greedy with that source. There are people right close to you desperate for freedom; so, start giving away Christ's forgiveness right in your marriage, your family, at the dinner table and the bedside, and go out from there. Let freedom ring. (3)




### **Preschool Ministry**
